

Emerging from the Bay area underground circa 2001, electro-noise duo Yellow Swans (Pete Swanson and Gabriel Mindel Saloman) draw lavers of abstract noise from disjointed drum machine rhythms, guitar feedback and all manner of broken electronics. The result is a weirdly inclusive brand of mangled glitch disco that elevates the listener rather than locking him behind impenetrable walls of noise. Tim Kasher and company have had six albums of impassioned, arty rock that trumps their Saddle Creek-mate Conor Oberst even at his whiny best. The upbeat, postcard cover of Cursive's latest, Happy Hollow, is a deceptive wrapper for the songs within. The record plays like a screed from a middle America tormented by religion gone bad and twisty characters looking for salvation. It is the band's finest work to date.
